



Commonly Asked Questions About the Flu Vaccine

- 1) Who gives the shots?
Registered Nurses (R.N.), Licensed Practical Nurses (LPN) and Certified Medical Assistants. Each nurse can vaccinate 25-30 recipients in an hour
- 2) What type of vaccine is it? It is a trivalent influenza vaccine and it is manufactured by Novartis
- 3) Can I get the flu vaccine if I am pregnant?
Not during your first trimester
- 4) Do you have medical backup?
Yes, Dr. Randy Cronic
- 5) How long have you been doing this?
Atlanta Health Systems has been in business 33 years, and performing vaccinations 13 years.
- 6) Minimum Age to receive shot?
10 years old.
- 7) How does the client pay?
We bill the client and they can pay within 21 days or we can collect from participants. The employee can also be reimbursed through their HSA/FSA.
- 8) Can we give Tetanus, Pneumonia, Shingles or B-12 Shots?

- 9) How long does each shot take?
1-2 minutes per person depending on if they have had the vaccine before, and have our Consent Form completed in advance.
- 10) Does Atlanta Health Systems have liability insurance?
Yes, certificate available upon request
- 11) Can Atlanta Health Systems provide other health screenings?
Yes, we offer Cholesterol, Glucose, Prostate (PSA), Thyroid (TSH), and health fairs

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
